ENDNOTES

1. The results included in this report are the results for the state for each PBIS criterion based on the number of partnerships selecting each criterion.
2. PBIS Results Reports are published annually. Data for these reports is collected to reflect the entire fiscal and/or calendar year. See the 2005-06 Data Collection Fact Sheet on SmartNet>Content Areas>ProgramandDataEvaluation>View All Documents>PBIS for the data collection timeframes for each PBIS criterion. Prior to FY03-04 results, data was collected in a timeframe that allowed the PBIS results to be published on June 30.
3. Partnerships re-selected PBIS criteria effective July 1, 2006. The numbers in this column reflect the number of counties selecting each criterion in the re-selection process. Because of the re-selection, the numbers in this column and the counties represented by the numbers may differ from previous years.
4. Base Year is the first year results are reported for a criteria. FY01-02 is the base year for most PBIS criteria. FY02-03 is the base year for 3 PBIS criteria: Availability (PLA10); Percent of Low Income in Subsidized Care (PLA30); and Percent of Children in Accredited (PLA70). FY05-06 is the base year for Parenting Skills - Competence and Confidence (FS10) and Family Literacy/Language Development (FS20).
5. Light gray shaded boxes indicate that no data was available to calculate results for these criteria in these years.
6. Dark gray shaded boxes indicate there has been a change in the wording of the criterion or its standard. The results previously published are not reported because they are no longer comparable.
7. Beginning with the FY05-06 results, the state and individual county results are calculated using the same methodology. In previous years, the state result was the average of the county results.
8. Legislation effective for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2003 and subsequent years revised the requirements for annual audits. Therefore, most partnerships are audited every other year. In FY04-05 the criteria were collapsed into one criteria called "audit findings."
9. Beginning with the FY04-05 report, the results for this criteria are expanded to one decimal point. This change makes the format consistent with how the results are reported in the data source - [Saturation Report](#), North Carolina Division of Public Health, Women's and Children's Section, Infant-Toddler Program.
10. The lower result in FY05-06 is primarily due to the change in methodology used to calculate the result. See Note 7.
11. The Health Check participation data is released during the fiscal year following the year to which the data applies. Therefore, the Health Check participation for fiscal year ended June 30, 2005 is reported under the column FY05-06. This also holds true for Health Check participation reported in previous years.
12. Beginning with the FY05-06 results, the minimum and high performing standard for this criterion is the same regardless of a county's status as a Health Check Project or Non-Health Check Project County.
13. The result is the average of the result for the 4 counties selecting this criterion. The data is not available to use apply the methodology referred to in Note 7.
14. State results are not reported because one or no partnership selected this criterion.

ENDNOTES

15. Beginning with the FY02-03 results, children enrolled in Head Start were added to the calculation of PLA20, PLA30, PLA40, PLA50, PLA60 and PLA70. Children enrolled in Head Start programs that are NOT in the DCD Regulatory Database are assigned a 4-star rating. Because it may not be possible to identify all Head Start programs in the DCD Regulatory System Database, there is potential for duplication.
16. Beginning with the FY02-03 results, the Smart Start Reporting System was added to the data sources for calculating PLA20, PLA30, PLA50 and PLA60.
17. Beginning with the FY04-05 results, the calculation of results gave a 4-star rating to any public school child care facility with a temporary license at the end of the fiscal year. With this addition, there is potential for duplication of child counts. Duplication of child counts may occur when children in these programs are also counted in the calculation of results for Head Start, More at Four and DPI databases.
18. Beginning with the FY05-06 results, the More at Four data included the number of children by facility and star rating. In previous years, the facility and star rating information was not provided resulting in the potential for duplication.
19. For the 05-06 report, the percent used to determine the number of children with special needs enrolled in Head Start was 12.5%. The Head Start Bureau reported that 12.5% of children enrolled in Head Start in FY04-05 (the latest year for which data is available) were children with special needs. In previous years, 10% was used.
20. Beginning with the FY05-06 results, the More at Four data included the number children with special needs. These children were assigned a 4-star rating.
21. The NCPC Board of Directors added Teacher Compensation (COMP10) to the list of mandatory PBIS criteria in January 2005. See " PBIS Criteria and Standards" on SmartNet>Content Areas>Program & Data Evaluation>View all Documents>PBIS for a full description of the selection requirements (pages 7 and 8).
22. The salary established in 2001 has been adjusted using the Consumer Price Index (CPI) to reflect the rate in 2006 dollars.
