Goals of New Funding

Opportunity

Statewide participation for each child in every community

Program Support

Adequate early literacy implementation capacity at state and local levels

Collaboration

Collaboration with community organizations, early literacy, and family engagement initiatives



Legislative Summary

- Final NC budget included recurring funds
 - \$3.5m in FY17-18
 - \$7m in FY18-19
 - Allocated to NCPC to increase access to Dolly Parton's Imagination Library
- Once fully implemented, access to the program shall be statewide



Funding Parameters

- Exempt from Smart Start match and child care 70/30 %
- By March 1, 2018, report to the Legislature
 - Success of program
 - Participation rates
 - Recommendations
- 2% designated for NCPC statewide evaluation

- Interviews with program staff and Executive Directors
- Phones calls with Local Partnerships
- On site meeting with DPIL staff
- Conversations with other states




What Local Partnerships say about

Funding Allocation Scenario #2

 - Request funding for planning
 - Peer planning support
- Explore sharing administrative services with other counties
- Begin enrolling children within 3 months
