## **Family Friday Activities**



## Infant/Toddler Age Activity: Family Tree

Supplies Needed:

- Pictures of the children, their family members, other familiar people (including staff members, pets, etc.), and class activities.
- Paper cut into the shape of a tree
- Clear contact paper

#### **Instructions:**

- Cover the "tree" with pictures collected. Pictures may overlap.
- Cover the "tree" with clear contact paper. Recycle cardboard for the backing.
- Place the "tree" at eye-level of the children in your classroom where it can be easily seen and touched by all children. The cozy area may be an especially good spot.

#### Pre-school Age

Activity: Flannel Family OR Who Am I?

Supplies Needed:

- Large piece of flannel
- Shapes of people and household items made out of flannel

#### **Instructions:**

- Hang a LARGE piece of flannel on the wall that is separated into rooms.
- Provide flannel pieces in shapes of people and household items for the children to place on the board.
- This would work well in your manipulatives center as well on a smaller scale!

## Who Am I?

- Ask questions that describe something a family member does at home.
- Let the children answer, and remember, there is no right or wrong answer here!
  - O Dads might be the ones to cook at home or Moms do the driving!
  - o I am thinking of a family member who cooks dinner; does dishes; feeds the dog, etc.

#### School Age

**Activity: Family Customs OR Family Fun** 

#### Supplies Needed:

- Family members
- Customs or interests and skills of family members
- Children's work

#### **Instructions:**

- Activity 1
  - o Invite families to share family customs interests, and skills
- Activity 2
  - o Family Fun: Invite families to a culminating event and showcase children's work and/or performances.

## Examples of language that can be used between caregiver and child:

#### Infants/Toddlers:

- "Yes! That's your Mommy with your brother. Where's Suise? Where's Tom?"
- "Oh, I see a doggy with curly black fur. Where do you think he's going?"
- "Daddy's giving you a hug in this picture. He's coming back later, isn't he?"

#### **Preschool:**

- "What is something fun you do with your family?"
- "How do you help you Mom or Dad cook dinner?"

#### School Age:

- "Do you speak other languages in your home? If so, can you teach us a few words."
- "What's one of your favorite meals and why?"
