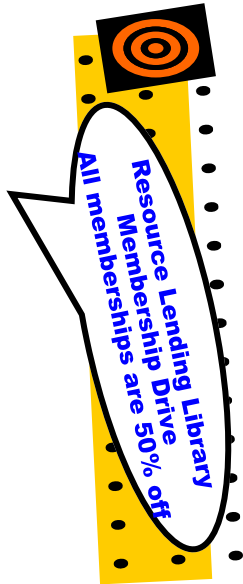

This workshop describes the components of breastfeeding friendly child care. Understanding personal feelings about breastfeeding, the benefits of breastfeeding, and risks of not breastfeeding will be discussed. Participants will identify the barriers to breastfeeding in child care and will examine the early care provider's role to reduce those barriers.

This Health and Safety for Infants and Toddlers course will focus on warning signs and prevention strategies for shaken baby syndrome, NC Child Care Rules, the forms that are required to be completed before giving medication, the prevention and control of infectious diseases in child care settings, and the stages of emergency preparedness and response. This training is for .5 CEU's and meets the following NC Child Care Rule for Health and Safety Training Requirements: #1 Prevention and Control of Infectious Diseases in Child Care; #2 Administration of Medication; #5 Emergency Preparedness and response, Planning for Emergencies Resulting from a Natural Disaster or a Man-Caused Event; #9 Prevention of Shaken Baby Syndrome and Abusive Head Trauma (SBS/AHT).

This workshop includes time spent indoors and out, allowing for plenty of time to explore theoretical concepts outside. Included are opportunities to discuss perceptions on play(ing), share ideas, and brainstorm ways to breakdown barriers to play. The workshop's aim is to help you build the knowledge, skills, motivation and confidence to enhance your own programs/lessons in ways that will support outdoor play.

HALO is designed to help children 3 - 5 years old understand the complexities of "health" and "healthy choices" and encourages healthy eating, exercise, and emotion recognition, as well as educates children about the harmful effects of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs on the body. Discussion will include important information about issues in the home, what signs of abuse and neglect to look for, and what providers are required to report.
