The highest rate the private sites can receive is \$650 for teachers with a BK license or equivalent. The base rate will increase from 650 to 663 if approved. There is recurring \$50 million swap each year, the past couple of years of state funds for TANF funds, PF will be included this year. NC Pre-K Transportation Plan SY: 2019-2020

On an annual basis, NC Pre-K sites are required to notify the Partnership for Children of Cumberland County of their ability to provide transportation services. Families with children participating in the NC Pre-K program may be charged a nominal amount for transportation to/from the NC Pre-K site if approved by the NC Pre-K Committee. However, children who are at-risk should not be denied services based on the family's inability to pay. NC Pre-K Sites assume all liability for transporting children and must adhere to the NC Child Care Licensing Requirements (Chapter 9 - Child Care Rules .1723 TRANSPORATION REQUIREMENTS). Sites providing transportation must submit a written description of the transportation services that addresses transporting children to and from the NC Pre-K site. The NC Pre-K site must disclose any fees to be charged to the family for the service, and NC Pre-K Committee approval is required to charge a fee.

NCPK TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

Transportation services are available to North Carolina Pre-Kindergarten (NCPK) participants at a rate of \$25.00 per month. Purchase of this service includes pick up and drop off between home and school on all instructional school days. Please be advised that eligibility for program entry is not affected by inability to pay for the additional service.

All vehicles used for transporting participants to and from the center will be currently registered and maintained in a clean and safe condition. Additionally, each vehicle will be:

- Driven by an adult with a current driver's license that authorizes driver to operate the type of vehicle driven.
- Contain a first aid kit
- Be equipped with individual, size appropriate safety restraints that are appropriate for the vehicle, installed and used correctly.

In order for daily drop off to take place an adult (18 and over) must be present at the home to receive and sign the participants out of the center's care. If no one is home at the time of drop off the participant will be transported back to the center and the parent will have to make arrangements for pick up. When regularly scheduled transportation is provided to and from school; the center must maintain a list of participants to be transported, route and scheduled stops, name and place where participant is to be dropped off.
