Overall, from Dec. 2019 to Dec., 2022, child care sites declined from 212 Centers to 192 (-9.4%), while Family Child Care Homes increased from 77 to 81 (+5.2%), but have still not rebounded to a high of 88 in January 2019.

Notes:

1) Five year-old preschool slots are challenging to measure because of those aging into Kindergarten.

2) CCS had 3,699 Kindergarten children in August 2022 (Confirmed Average Daily Membership Revised, NC DPI).

3) NC Pre-K had an estimated enrollment of 1295 in December 2022.

4) The December 2022 estimated infant population (e.g. < one year old) was 5297. There were 480 child care slots available, or about 9%, or about 1 slot for every 11 infants.

5) The proportion of Family Child Care Homes accepting Subsidized Care dropped from 67% in January 2021 to 58% by December 2022 – a 8.6% decline.

6) The proportion of Child Care Centers accepting Subsidized Care remained mostly stable, with a high of 75% in January 2021, compared to 74% by December 2022.
