In response to the Request for Application to recruit new NC Pre-K sites for 2024-2026 school years, the following six childcare facilities submitted complete applications:

- 1. 1st Start Child Development Center 1425 McArthur Rd., Fayetteville
- 2. Gracie's Childcare and Learning Center 1140 Sand Hill Rd., Hope Mills
- 3. Hearts for Children Childcare and Learning Center 541 Bunce Rd., Fayetteville
- 4. Jump Start University Early Learning Center 107 University Ave., Fayetteville
- 5. Little Angels Childcare and Development Center 8926 Cliffdale Rd., Fayetteville
- 6. Little Beginningz Learning Center 4906 Rosehill Rd., Fayetteville

Summary of Process:

- The NC Pre-K Committee appointed and approved by vote the following Sub-Committee members: Mr. Jerome Scott, Gwen Brown, Patricia Eaton and Alisha Myers. The NC Pre-K Staff provided training to the Site Selection Sub-Committee before beginning the site selection process. The NC Pre K Site Selection Sub-Committee received training Friday, October 20, 2023. Mr. Jerome Scott was nominated as the Chair, and Ms. Gwen Brown as the Co-Chair.
- The Site Selection Sub-Committee completed a Rubric for each eligible site applicant, using information from the NC Pre-K Site Application and supporting documentation submitted by applicants. Additional information was gathered during onsite sessions to verify DCDEE and NC Pre-K compliance. The Site Selection Sub-Committee met several times to finalize the rubric scores before submitting their recommendation.

Action Item

- A. The NC Pre-K Site Selection Sub-Committee unanimously recommends approval to add the following four facilities as new NC Pre-K site beginning the 2024-2025 school year. The approved site will enter into a two-year contract pending annual funding allocation: 7/1/2024 – 6/30/2026.

The minutes of the August 24, 2023 meeting were previously distributed and reviewed by the Committee. Lisa Childers moved to approve the North Carolina Pre-Kindergarten (NC Pre-K) Planning Committee Minutes from August 24, 2023, as presented. Sandee Gronowski seconded the motion. Mary Sonnenberg reported on the Site Allocation Change Requests. PFC updated procedures to accept allocation requests annually on July 15th and October 15th. 	the waiting list so staff is recommending 9 slots, Burns asked but has withdrawn their request for allocation, CCS – requested 130 additional slots; staff recommends 100 slots for CCS. PFC staff is recommending 9 slots for FSU, 9 for Stepping Stones #6, and 100 slots for CCS, effective November 1, 2023. Each child has already been determined eligible for the NC Pre-K Program. Governor Cooper announced plans to direct \$8 million in GEER funds to provide a one-time special allocation to all NC Pre-K classrooms. In order to be eligible to receive GEER funds the NC Pre-K classroom must have 1 or more NC Pre-K children enrolled and have a qualified lead teacher or long-term substitute in place in the NC Pre-K Plan database during the month of September 2023. NC Pre-K classrooms that have been allocated slots and have qualified staff in place will be eligible to receive GEER funds as long as at least one child qualifies for reimbursement during the month of September. NC Pre-K classrooms that meet the eligibility criteria described in Section II will be eligible to receive a one-time allocation of approximately \$3,860 per classroom.	None	None

SUBJECT: Proposed Recommendation for Action - Legislative Increased Ratio &

Slot Availability

Session Law 2013-134, Section 9D.1.(a1) allowed for increased ratio and slot availability for NC Pre-K classrooms (attached DCDEE memo). While this legislation allows for individual classrooms to increase classroom size, classrooms are not obligated to increase their class size. In addition, DCDEE did not receive additional funding to increase slot allocation for the NC Pre-K Program. DCDEE has issued guidance that it is optional to implement this change.

- 1. Staff presented information regarding this law to the NC Pre-K Planning Committee at the October 26, 2023 Planning Committee meeting. At that time, staff recommended getting feedback from the NC Pre-K Directors meeting and coming back to the NC Pre-K Planning Committee with a recommendation at the December 14, 2023 Planning Committee Meeting.
- 2. Consensus at the NC Pre-K Directors meeting on November 16, 2023 was to not implement an increase at this time in ratios from the current guidelines of a ratio of one to 9 children and a maximum class size of 18 with at least one teacher and one teacher assistant. A class of 9 or fewer children shall have at least one teacher.
- 3. The staff recommendation is to make no changes in ratio and class size requirements in NC Pre-K classrooms at this time.

Action Item

Staff, with feedback from the NC Pre-K Directors group, recommends no changes in the current NC Pre-K guidelines of a ratio of one to 9 children and a maximum class size of 18 with at least one teacher and one teacher assistant. A class of 9 or fewer children shall have at least one teacher.

This action item will be revisited with the Planning Committee upon any additional guidance or requirements from DCDEE regarding this law.

Re: Increased Classroom Ratio & Slot Availability

NC Pre-K contracting agencies must provide this memo to all NC Pre-K sites

On October 3, 2023, <u>Session Law 2023-134</u> became law. Section 9D.1.(a1) of this legislation states the following:

Staff-To-Child Ratio and Class Size. – The classroom shall not exceed a maximum staff-to-child ratio of one to 10 with a maximum class size of 20 children, with at least one teacher and one teacher assistant per classroom. A classroom of 10 children or less shall have at least one teacher. The Child Care Commission shall adopt any rules and the Division of Child Development and Early Education shall revise any rules or policies necessary to implement the provisions of this subsection.

While this legislation allows for individual classrooms to serve more children, classrooms are not obligated to increase their classroom size. It is important to note that **DCDEE received no additional funding to increase slot allocations for the NC Pre-K program**. However, the following options may be considered for those wishing to increase capacity within their classrooms:

- If you are a <u>site</u> choosing to increase your classroom size, you may do so by serving non-NC Pre-K children in addition to your allocated NC Pre-K slots. This option **does not allow** you to replace current NC Pre-K slots with non-NC Pre-K children.
- If you are an NC Pre-K contracting agency you may identify existing NC Pre-K slots within your county/region that are currently unallocated or unfilled and reallocate those slots to interested classrooms at the discretion of the local NC Pre-K Committee.
